CRYSTAL CONJURE MAGIC

Mistletoe never touches the ground. It grows high in the branches of other trees, rooted in bark rather than earth, green and heavy with pearl-white berries in the dead of winter when its host stands bare — a plant that seems to belong to no ordinary realm, neither quite of the tree nor of the soil beneath it, hanging in the air between earth and sky. That strangeness made it, to the old peoples of Europe, the most sacred plant that grew. It keeps its own green leaves through the killing cold and makes its own food from the thin winter light, thriving where nothing else can by simply living differently from everything around it.

To the Druids it was the all-heal, cut from the sacred oak at the solstice with a golden sickle and never let to fall — for a plant that lived between the worlds was thought to open the way between them. It is the original golden bough: the branch Aeneas carried to pass living into the underworld and return, the talisman that unlocks the door most firmly shut. From that same betweenness comes its gentler magic — the sprig hung overhead at midwinter, beneath which enemies laid down their quarrels and lovers kissed, a truce-token and a love-charm at once.

Its governing oracle suits that nature exactly. Mistletoe answers to *Adapting to the Times* — stay supple, follow worthy examples, and never harden into rigid ways. Mistletoe is adaptability itself, the plant that survives the winter by bending its whole way of living, at home in the in-between where others cannot go.

The kiss and devoted love, the making of peace, the crossing between worlds, and the grace to adapt and thrive — four gifts of the golden bough. This little book gives you one working for each.

One sober warning belongs here at the front: mistletoe and its white berries are POISONOUS — never eaten, never brewed, and kept well away from children and pets, however merrily the sprig hangs at Christmas. Everything here is for external charm-craft only: hung, placed, and offered, never taken internally in any form. Do the ritual, then meet it halfway in the ordinary world.



♦ 1 · Mistletoe for the Kiss — The Sprig at the Door

*Venus-Aligned Mistletoe · a Space & Home working · the technique:
"Add a Natural Element"*

Why this working. This is mistletoe's most beloved magic: the sprig hung overhead beneath which lovers kiss — the ancient love-charm of the between-place, drawing true and devoted love toward the one who hangs it. Under Venus, who leads a true, devoted love to your door, the hung sprig becomes a beacon. This working adds the mistletoe to your doorway as the natural element that calls that love in.

You will need

- **Venus Aligned Mistletoe** — the hero, to lead a true, devoted love to your door
- **Sedna Aligned Spanish Moss** — for a love that endures the long haul
- **Venus Aligned Jasmine** — for soul-deep, tender devotion
- **Rose Quartz** — the keystone of true love and the open heart
- **Vanilla Salt** — the sweet, warm salt of loving welcome
- A sprig of mistletoe to hang, and a doorway or threshold

The working. This is *Add a Natural Element* — you place a natural token in your space to shift it. Choose a doorway you pass beneath.

Set a little **Spanish Moss** and **Jasmine** with a pinch of **Vanilla Salt** on the sill, hold the **Rose Quartz**, then hang the sprig of **Mistletoe** overhead. (Handle the sprig, then wash your hands — it is not to be eaten, and keep it out of reach of children and pets.)

The charged moment. Stand beneath the hung sprig and look up at it — the between-plant, the old kiss-charm, the beacon for devoted love. Picture the true love you wish to draw to your door, warm and lasting. (Dried mistletoe has little scent, so let this working live in the sight of the sprig overhead and the intention you hold beneath it.) Say it: *Beneath the golden bough, I call a true and devoted love to my door.* Leave the sprig hanging, and pass beneath it often.

Keep it. Refresh the sprig each season, and touch the Rose Quartz when you pass beneath, holding the wish steady.

Then meet it halfway. The sprig calls the love toward your door — you still open the door and let it in: go out, meet people, be warm and available. The working draws it near; you welcome it.





♦ 2 · Mistletoe for Making Peace — The Peace Offering

Saturn-Aligned Mistletoe · an Offering working · the technique: "Water Ripple Offering"

Why this working. Beneath the midwinter sprig, enemies laid down their quarrels — mistletoe is the truce-plant, the maker of peace, and under Saturn it makes that truce and the mended bond *last*. This working sends a peace-offering out onto water, letting the ripple carry your wish for a lasting reconciliation outward toward the one you're at odds with.

You will need

- **Saturn Aligned Mistletoe** — the hero, to make a truce and bond last
- **Quaoar Aligned Calendula** — to keep the peace gentle between you
- **Venus Aligned Spanish Moss** — for a bond that holds over time
- **Rhodonite** — the keystone of reconciliation and forgiveness
- **Lavender Salt** — the calming salt of a quarrel set down
- A bowl or still body of water, and a small leaf or pebble to offer

The working. This is a *Water Ripple Offering* — you drop a token into water and let the ripple carry the intention out. Set the **Mistletoe**, **Calendula**, and **Spanish Moss** with a little **Lavender Salt** beside the

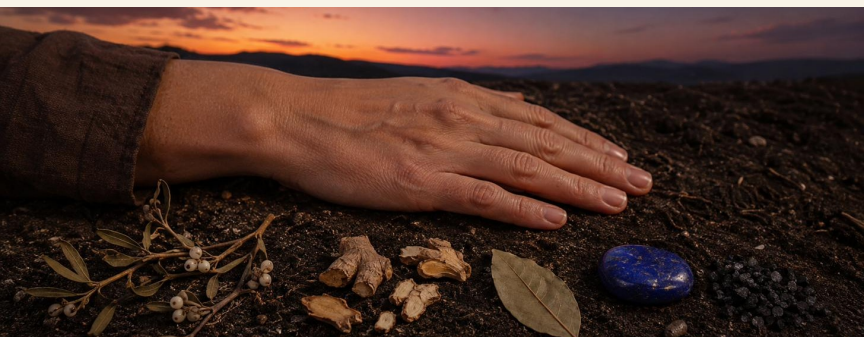
water, hold the **Rhodonite**, and take up a small leaf or pebble.

The charged moment. Hold the token and put into it your wish for peace with the one you're at odds with — not who was right, only that the quarrel be set down and the bond mended for good. Then drop it gently into the water and watch the ripple spread outward. (No scent here; the working lives in the ripple carrying your peace outward and the words you speak.) Say it: *I set the quarrel down; let this peace go out to them, and let the mending last.* Let the water still again before you go.

Keep it. Carry the Rhodonite when you next face them, and make the ripple-offering again if the peace needs renewing.

Then meet it halfway. The offering sends the peace out — you still make the real gesture: the message, the apology, the open hand. The working softens the way; you take the step.





♦ 3 · Mistletoe for Crossing Between Worlds — The Touch of Earth

Pluto-Aligned Mistletoe · an Offering working · the technique: "Earth Touch Gesture"

Why this working. Mistletoe is the golden bough itself — the branch that let Aeneas pass living into the underworld and return, the plant that guards the crossing between worlds. Under Pluto, keeper of that deep threshold, it wards you as you move between one realm and another: grief and the dead, the seen and the unseen, an ending and what lies past it. This working touches the earth as an offering at that threshold, honoring the crossing and asking safe passage.

You will need

- **Pluto Aligned Mistletoe** — the hero, to guard the crossing between worlds
- **Pluto Aligned Ginger** — for the courage to make the crossing
- **Ceres Aligned Bay Leaf** — for a blessing on the threshold
- **Lapis Lazuli** — the keystone of the deep, the otherworld, and true sight
- **Witch's Black Salt** — the warding salt of a protected passage
- A patch of bare earth or floor, and a little of the herbs

The working. This is an *Earth Touch Gesture* — you touch the ground as an offering and a grounding. Set the **Mistletoe**, **Ginger**, and **Bay**

Leaf with a little **Witch's Black Salt** before you, hold the **Lapis Lazuli**, and kneel where you can lay a hand flat on bare earth or floor.

The charged moment. Lay your palm flat and feel the ground beneath it — the fixed point at the edge of the crossing. Name what you are crossing between: the grief you're moving through, the door you're passing, the goodbye, the threshold of the unseen. Ask the golden bough's guardianship for a safe passage there and back. (No scent; the working lives in the hand on the earth and the words.) Say it: *Golden bough, guard my crossing; let me pass between and return whole.* Press your hand a moment longer, then rise.

When it's done. Keep the Lapis Lazuli with you through the passage, and scatter the Witch's Black Salt at the threshold you're crossing.

Then meet it halfway. The touch of earth wards the crossing — you still walk it consciously, honoring what you move between. The working guards the passage; you make it.





♦ 4 · Mistletoe for Adapting to Change — The Supple Breath

Gonggong-Aligned Mistletoe · a Breath working · the technique:
"Breath Over Hands"

Why this working. Mistletoe is adaptability itself — the plant that survives the killing winter by living differently, bending its whole way of being to thrive where nothing else can. Its oracle is *Adapting to the Times*: stay supple, never harden. Under Gonggong, who brings a flexible grace to the unknown, it lends that same limber resilience. This working breathes warmth over your open hands, softening the braced grip that change tightens in us, so you can bend with it instead of breaking.

You will need

- **Gonggong Aligned Mistletoe** — the hero, to bring a flexible grace to the unknown
- **Mercury Aligned Lemongrass** — to clear the way for a change of course
- **Sedna Aligned Rosemary** — to carry your core self through the change
- **Amethyst** — the keystone of calm adaptation and going with the flow
- **Flake Salt** — the light, quick salt of easy, supple change
- A little of the herbs in a dish, and a quiet moment to yourself

The working. This is a *Breath Over Hands* — you breathe warmth over your open hands to soften and settle. Set the **Mistletoe**, **Lemongrass**, and **Rosemary** in the dish with a little **Flake Salt**, hold the **Amethyst** a moment, then cup your open hands before you.

The charged moment. Bring your open, cupped hands to your face and breathe slowly out over them, feeling the warmth. As you breathe, let your hands — and everything braced in you against the change — soften and open, unclenching the grip. Picture yourself like the mistletoe: green through the winter, bending your whole way of living to thrive in what's coming rather than fighting it. (No scent needed; the working lives in the warm breath and the softening.) Say it: *I bend, and I stay green; I adapt, and I thrive*. Open your hands fully.

Keep it. Return to the supple breath whenever change has you braced and rigid. Carry the Amethyst through the shifting time.

Then meet it halfway. The breath softens the grip — you still do the adapting; try the new way, follow the better example, let the old rigid habit go. The working keeps you supple; you bend and thrive.



◆ Choose Your Mistletoe

Four gifts of the golden bough, and there are more. Every one of the seventeen celestial bodies turns mistletoe toward a different grace — Mars to call a truce and guard what you love, Neptune to open sacred divination by the trees, the Moon for tender peace and easy goodwill, Uranus to free the authentic, free-spirited heart.

Where to start:

- For **drawing a true, devoted love** → Venus-Aligned Mistletoe
- For **making a lasting peace** → Saturn-Aligned Mistletoe
- For **warding a crossing between worlds** → Pluto-Aligned Mistletoe

We did the prep. You do the magic.

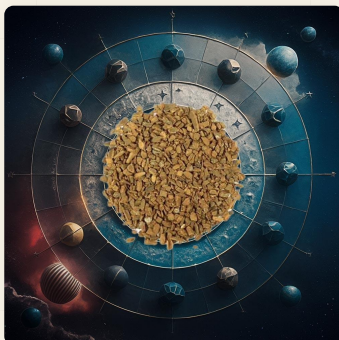
